2. LIST OF TEAMS: *16U/17U/18U Prep teams play in the CSSHL and we have a 12U AA Weekend Model, 14UAAA Weekend Model team*
3. LOCATION AND YEAR THE PROGRAM ENTERED THE CSSHL: *We are located in beautiful Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. It's a small (44,000 population) resort town in the mountains on the lake. We became members in the CSSHL 2013.*
4. EDUCATION
 - a. Partner school: *we are a fully accredited, private school that offers NCAA approved courses. We do PSAT and SAT testing on site*
 - b. What are some of the things your program does to provide educational support? *We have a Principal, full time teaching staff and an Academic Advisor. We are an "in-learning" school. Our teaching staff provides support for our students throughout the entire school year*
 - c. How are grades monitored and how often? *Every Monday our teaching staff meets with our owner and hockey department to discuss/monitor our students progress*
 - d. How are courses and the graduation path for student athletes chosen? *Our Principal and Academic Advisor look through incoming students transcripts and meet with our families to make sure they are taking the required classes to graduate with the required number of credits needed. Our graduates receive diplomas from Coeur d'Alene Hockey Academy.*
 - e. Do you have an academic probation policy? *Yes, if they do not meet the CSSHL standards (70% average) they are not permitted to play in games*
5. RESIDENTIAL LIFE
 - a. Do you offer a billeting program or a dormitory for non-local student athletes? *Yes, we have a dorm and use a billeting program. We have a full time billet coordinator on staff that monitors our billets and dorm.*
 - b. What kind of life skills to the student athletes learn by living in the dorms or with billets? *It's important that our student/athletes become independent young men/women that are prepared for university and life after hockey. We strive to develop well rounded student/athletes that will become leaders in their communities. Time management is an area we see our student/ahletes really improve/excel in as well as becoming independent. They need to be self motivated but we have a great support staff (billet coordinator, principal, teachers, advisors and hockey staff) that mentor our student/athletes. All our offices are on campus so that gives us the opportunity to build relationships with our student/athletes and help them with their transition into the academy life and prepares them for university and Jr hockey.*

6. STUDENT ATHLETE HEALTH

- a. How are injuries and sick student athletes monitored? ***We have access to some of the top doctors and AT's in the area. We have a sports medicine doctor, concussion specialist, and PT, OCS, SCS, ATC, LAT, MTC, CSCS on staff. Our billet coordinator schedules appointments for our athletes when the need arises. We offer shuttle service to their appointments and are in constant contact with our families when there is an injury or sickness.***

7. SCHEDULE

- a. What days the daily schedule look like for a student athlete in your program?

School: 8:15am-2:30pm

Practices: Mo-Th we schedule practices during school (8:00-9:15am, 11:15-12:30pm & 2:15-3:30pm)

Skills/Goalie Seesions: Tu & Wed 6:45-7:45am

Off Ice Strength/Conditioning: each team works with our full time strength coach 4 x week for 1 hour

****Post season we continue with our development and have skills sessions, off ice training and a 3 v 3 Spring League. This is goes Mo-Th and we have an open ice session every Friday for the players.***

****this is all accomplished within their time at school and the latest our student/athletes get home is 5:30pm***

- b. How many games can your teams expect to play? ***50-55 games (CSSHL league games, 2-3 tournaments and exhibition games). We play games in both the USA and Canada***
- c. What does the on and off ice training look like? ***We have our own weight room (10,000 sq ft) and a full time strength coach that works with our athletes 4 x week from August-May. We own and operate our own weight room and it's right on campus***
- d. How long does your program run? ***Our athletes arrive at the end of August and school ends at the end of May***

- a. What is including in the price to attend the program? ***Breakdown of fees- USA students \$26,995 and International students \$28,995. Billeting fees are \$625/mo. These fees include everything regarding academics and hockey for our student athletes. Our program tuition includes tournament/league fees, travel, hotel, team meals, practices, skills/strength sessions, all outer hockey gear (game/practice jerseys & socks, helmets, gloves, hockey bag, pant shells) and team swag (hoody, joggers, jacket, hats, dry fit shirts/shorts).***
